They consist of boiled wheat decorated with dry nuts and fruits: pomegranates, raisins, almonds. Kollyva and its ingredients have many symbolisms and are offered to the church, wishing for 'Eternal Memory and Peace' of the deceased.

In Cyprus today, *Mnemosynon* -the memorial service at church, is still a strong ceremonial tradition even for people who are not close to the church, as all families still give special attention of offering this service every year at church and remember their beloved ones, gathering the whole family together.
